Come and join us to see what the Spirit is doing in your church. We look forward to worshipping with you.



LUMC given discount from new insurance company

Last month we informed congregants that our previous church insurance carrier had cancelled our insurance, along with 40% of other churches had covered. In searching for a new company to cover LUMC for insurance, our agent, Derek Savage, could only find one insurance company willing to cover our church, GuideOne, a fairly common church insurance company.

newsletter, we were told our insurance would increasing by \$18,000 more a year than we paid with Grinnell to a total of \$30,139, or approximately an additional \$1,500/month more than we've been paying. However, a week into the month of October, Savage informed us that he was able to convince GuideOne to give us a 15% discount on our insurance premiums.

Not only did that reduce our first month's payment by \$1,300, it also reduces our monthly payments from \$2,500 to \$2,009! Therefore, at the time of our October

Knipmeyer praise Band livens up October 29th worship service.


