he 2024 Church Council leaders met on Monday, March 18th.

Pastor Andrew opened the meeting with a prayer. His prayer was based on Luke 9:59-60: "To another he said, "Follow me." But he said, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father." And Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

Treasurer Teri James spoke about the -Pastor Andrew will have "Coffee finance report and said finances were "rough" at the end of February. She reported that the church needs a minimum of \$11, 881 a month to pay regular bills and \$13,740 a month in order to also pay apportionments. Custodian Glenda Brooks lowered her -Bring back "Children's Moment." monthly fee by \$290 per month.

## What is the time between Easter and Pentecost?

or Christians, Easter is not just one day - it's a season of 50 days, a week of weeks, derived in its length from the fifty days between Passover and Pentecost (which means fiftieth) in Judaism. Easter season begins at sunset on the eve of Easter and ends with Pentecost, the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church (see Acts 2).

Easter season is more than an extended celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. In the early church, Lent was a season when persons who wished to become Christians were learning how to live the way of Jesus and preparing for baptism on Easter Sunday. Christians have referred to this time of formation as "catechesis" or "echoing the way of

Jesus." The original purpose of the Easter Christ the King/Reign of Christ Sunday. season was to continue the formation of new Christians in the faith. Christians have historically referred to this formation process as "mystagogy" or "leading people into the mysteries."

Today, this extended season gives us time to rejoice and experience what we mean when we say Christ is risen and that we, as the church, are the body of the Risen Lord. It's a season for focusing on the core doctrines and mysteries of the faith and for preparing for the ministries the Spirit has empowered us to undertake in Jesus' name.

This year, Pentecost Sunday is May 19, 2024. The season after Pentecost begins with Trinity Sunday and concludes with

The purpose of this season is to support our common work of using the gifts we have been given in the name of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Season after Pentecost, also called Ordinary Time, begins the day after Pentecost and ends the day before the First Sunday of Advent. It may include twenty -three to twenty-eight Sundays, depending on the date of Easter, but the first Sunday is always Trinity Sunday, and the last Sunday is always the Sunday of the Reign of Christ or Christ the King. The season also includes All Saints and Thanksgiving.
